OMC JURY GUIDEBOOK -JANUARY "2024"

Dear OMC, affiliated member countries jurors,

This Jury Guidebook has been created to assist all affiliated jurors in maintaining the highest standard when judging OMC international competitions worldwide.

For fair judging results, OMC has set up a new jury grouping system, the jury groups will be composed of 8 jurors, 5 OMC professional jurors which are the OMC competition Directors and or selected by OMC supranational jurors + 3 supranational jurors from affiliated member countries organization selected by lotto.

Supranational jurors can only judge in the sections where they have attended the 2023 OMC Global Certification in Milano: (Hair Ladies, Hair Gents, Aesthetics or Nails Section).

A Jury Briefing takes place the day before each World Championship. OMC will inform the jurors in advance of the date and place were to meet.

OMC may select educators from affiliated member country organizations to present OMC educational masterclasses worldwide representing OMC HAIRWORLD ACADEMY.

VERSION 2024 2024 OMC CHAMPIONSHIP PARIS

OMC Professional and Supranational Jurors

1. Juror Qualification

All OMC jurors must have attended the 2023 OMC Jurors Global Certification in Milano will gain the priority of being select to judge 2024 OMC World Championship.

2. OMC countries affiliated supranational Jury Selection

OMC will send a request to all countries affiliated organization to send 1 Jurors for each of the sections below as long they have competitors in the concerned sections. (Ladies and Gents Hair, Aesthetics & Nail sections.

3. The jury groups

The jury groups will be composed of 8 jurors: 5 OMC professional jurors which can be from the OMC competition Directors + 3 countries supranational from OMC affiliated organizations.

4. <u>Professional Jurors are appointed by OMC HAIRWORLD Committee</u>

OMC Competition Directors are considered professional jurors representing OMC HAIRWORLD.

5. Fair Judging

To establish fair judging, the juror score for his own country does not count.

6. New Jurors

The OMC HAIRWORLD Competition Committee will decide if the scores of a new juror will count.

7. Jury Briefing

At the jury briefing the day before the championship, only selected jurors will receive an envelope showing which tests they will be judging.

8. <u>Jurors dress code</u>

To establish a unifying dress code, it is essential that all Gents jurors wears black attire during the judging segment. The attire can be trendy or classic. Shirts and scarfs can be of any color. The Ladies jurors' dress code is white and blue or white and black with other accent colors.

9. <u>Juror Disqualification</u>

The OMC HAIRWORLD Competition Committee will decide the sanctions depending on the infraction committed.

COMPETITION COORDINATORS POSITION

The Competition Coordinators of the concerned 3 sections is composed of knowledgeable member countries organizations whose members are invited by the OMC World President to be part of the competition directors commission of the concerned year.

The OMC President will send an Invitation letter 3 months before the OMC world championship of the concerned year. Those knowledge hairstylists who are privileged to assist in directing the OMC championships.

Their position is on a voluntary basis, they are responsible to pay their own travel and accommodation if they accept the invitation.

Functions of the OMC HAIRWORLD Competition Committee

- 1. One of the OMC officials will direct the Jury Briefing the day before the championship.
- 2. Each competition directors will receive a job description by the OMC HAIRWORLD competition committee.
- 3. The Competition Coordinators direct all competitors in the village holding area according to each of the concerned categories. The mirror number will be distributed in the competitor's village holding area. Those competitors will be accompanying in the championship arena and direct them to their assigned mirrors numbers.
- 4. Before the competition starts, the General Commissioner together with the Competition Coordinators will check all model / MH of their concerned sections to make sure all participants have observed OMC rules.
- **5.** It is advised that the competition Coordinators to take a photo of the infraction, with the OMC camera. The photo is a sustainable proof of the infraction. If no photo of the infraction was made, no proof is available; therefore, the infraction cannot be implemented. (Except for the stop instruction).
- 6. All decisions made by the OMC General Commissioners must be signed together with one of the OMC HAIRWORLD official.
- 7. One of the Competition Coordinator will be assigned to take the sealed envelope of the concerned Jurors score cards to the computer staff. The computer programmers will enter the penalty points in the concerned competition tests.

OMC Scoring System Example

Jurors' country scores, as well as red cards, are removed and replaced by the average of all other jurors, basing on the first rectification of the juror concerned.

Scores given by jurors

$$28 - 26 - 30 - 27 - 28 - 25 - 25$$

First rectification

Scores given by jurors to competitors of their own country are omitted (27 in this case)

Calculation of first average omitting score 27

$$28 + 26 + 30 + 28 + 25 + 25 = 162$$
; $6 = 27$

New average based on the remaining jurors' scores:

$$27 + 27 + 27 + 27 + 27 + 27 + 27 = 189$$

Second rectification

Based on the competitor ranking calculated on first rectification scores, red cards are calculated. Scores given by jurors with red card are omitted (30 in this example)

Calculation of average omitting score 27 (national juror) and score with red card 30 (red card).

$$28 + 26 + 28 + 25 + 25 = 132$$
: $5 = 26.4$

Final score: $26.4 \times 7 = 184.8$

Attribution of Red Cards

The scores of country jurors and of jurors receiving red cards will be omitted. After recalculation, these jurors' cards will be replaced by the average score of all other jurors.

Individual red card

- If the score 30 is found on the 7th place or lower 1 time in a test.
- If the score 29 is found on the 8^h place or lower 1 time in a test.
- If the score 28 is found on the 9th place or lower 1 time in a test.
- If the score 27 is found on the 10th place or lower 1 time in a test.
- If the score 25 is found on the first 1st. place in a test.

Incompetence or unfair judging

In addition to the red cards given automatically by the computer, the Lenience Committee may disqualify jurors whose judging is found to be incompetent or unfair, even if they have not received any red cards.

OMC Lenience Committee

A Lenience Committee will analyze the scores given by jurors who received red cards. The OMC Lenience Committee can remove red cards accordingly to their final objective analysis.

Selection of the winning hairstyles (10 or more competitors)

To ensure fairness in all OMC competitions, jurors must be clear, unbiased, systematic, and efficient to accomplish these tasks, below are the recommended judging guidelines and criteria.

The OMC scoring system allows to focus **only** on the top scores indicated in the boxes. Follow the steps below.

- 1. <u>First walk-through:</u> The jurors look at the general work of all competitors without assessing any scores but taking notes with the plus + and minus signs.
- 2. <u>Second walk-through:</u> Start selecting the top 3 winners, following with the 4th and 5th place.
- 3. <u>Select the top 3 scores:</u> The scores 30, 29, 28 must be given only 1 time (check the score chart).
- 4. <u>Score 27:</u> The score 27 can be given a maximum of 2 times (check the score chart).
- 5. <u>Score 26:</u> The score 26 can be given a maximum of 4 times (check the score chart).
- 6. <u>Score 25:</u> The score 25 not being included in the box, it is no longer needed to be assessed. All competitors automatically receive the score 25.

By following the above steps, you have completed your professional task and may qualify you to be awarded the OMC's Best Juror Award if you have reached 114 points in 1 test.

A juror who receives a red card in a championship does not qualify for receiving the Best Juror Award in that championship, even if he/she has reached the 114 points.



Suspension / Disqualification / Penalty Rules – Re: Red card page

1. General rules to be observed.

- a. If a juror arrives late at the Jury Room, the General Commissioner will decide if he/she will be admitted in the Jury Room and to judge the test.
- b. Jurors are not allowed to leave the Jury Room while waiting to judge, except for going to the restroom.
- c. Once a juror has turned in his scorecard, he must leave the Championship Arena and directly go back to the Jury Room if he/she is selected to judge other tests.
- d. Jurors once they are finished judging, are found to be circulating in the competition arena will have their scores omitted and will not be allowed to continue judging in that championship.

2. <u>Immediate disqualification of jurors</u>

- a. Jurors directing other jurors to see a particular mirror number.
- b. Jurors talking to each other on the competition floor.
- c. Jurors using mobile phones in the Jury Room or on the Competition Floor.
- d. Jurors taking pictures while judging on the Competition Floor.

3. Voiding of Scorecards

If a juror shows inexperience during a competition (skipping a score, illegible scorecard, not completing judging in time), the General Commissioner may disregard his/her scorecard at any time.

4. Consequences of red card attribution

The official notification concerning the red cards will be sent to the jurors' organizations and to the jurors concerned.

5. Disqualification Re: red card page

Equal Results

Individual tests

- 1. The President of the Jury is appointed by OMC according to best judging record.
- 2. In case of equal scores, the scores of the Jury President determine the first place in each test (Ladies and Gents).
- 3. In case the tie is not broken, the computer will continue using the sequence of the jury list down to the last juror.

General Classification in combination or team competitions

If two teams have equal scores, ties will be broken by comparing the scores of the competitors of each team, combination or individual, starting from top downward. The advantage will be given to the competitors/teams that have the higher scores in the following tests:

1.	Ladies	Hair by Night	MH

2. Ladies Romantic Bridal MH

3. Ladies Prestige Gala LM

4. Gents Street Cut MH

5. Gents Classic Cut MH

6. Gents Skin Fade Cut MH

Best Juror Award - only for jurors who are judging the seniors' tests.

The Best Juror Award will be presented every year to the jurors who have obtained the highest points in a test.

The number of competitors must be 10 or more in a test. A juror receiving a red card does not qualify for the Best Juror Award.

Judging Example - Evaluation

The evaluation is made by adding up the top four (4) competitors' scores of each test. Only jurors reaching 114 points in a test will receive the "Best Juror Award".
